Each entry in these divisions shall have been made or produced by the exhibitor.

Scoreboards in corresponding Senior & Junior Divisions shall be used unless otherwise provided in these divisions. Junior Organization Exhibitors enrolled in projects where Organization Divisions are offered (4-H & FFA) are not eligible to enter the Open Junior Department.

If a Division is not offered for an organizational project, the Junior Organizational Exhibitor may enter in the Open Junior Department. No cross entries are allowed.

Child's age must be on entry form & on exhibit tags. Every picture, drawing, etc., must be on poster board with stapled string hanger or professional hanging materials attached & ready to hang. **DO NOT USE TAPE AS IT WILL NOT HOLD.**

RULES:

1. The quality desired in agricultural & horticultural products is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market. Such exhibits must be at least equal in maturity to that ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural Code in Order to be considered for premium awards.
2. "Mature" means having reached that state of ripeness which will ensure palatability, after the removal of the product from the tree, vine or plant.
3. Overripe means having an advanced state of maturity which causes the product to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state.
4. Exhibitors must furnish their own containers for exhibits.
5. Topped vegetables should have tops cut 1"-2". Bunched vegetables should have sufficient tops to be tied together.
